## **1 - Diya Pakistan Continues its Efforts for Flood Relief & Rehabilitation**

While the water level has receded in majority of the flood affected areas, the damages it has caused demand a lot more from development organizations.

The flood has hit some of the worst and marginalized villages and towns of Pakistan. People who were already living below the poverty line have now lost their meager belongings too. The sources of livelihood have been destroyed and the road to revival is even harder.

It is in these catastrophic circumstances that organizations like Diya Pakistan are trying their level best to make sure that maximum number of flood affected people benefit from our program and projects in these areas.



With your support and generosity, Diya Pakistan has raised a total funding of Rs. 48.3 million for its flood relief and rehabilitation program.

## **2 - Flood Relief & Rehabilitation Initiatives**

Building upon the initial efforts, Diya has undertaken the following activities in relief and rehabilitation sector:

### **Immediate Shelter**

Diya Pakistan donated 450 tents to Pakistan Air Force, Base Faisal, Karachi for onward distribution to flood affected families.

### **Clothing & Toys**

On the auspicious occasion of Eid-ul-Fitr, Diya Pakistan distributed 1,000 pieces of stitched clothing for flood affected children and women in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The same quantity of clothes and 1,000 toys for children in addition, were distributed by our team in the flood affected areas of Rahim Yar Khan.

### **Blankets**

As winter is approaching and majority of the flood affected families are still living in temporary shelters, there's a need for provision of blankets in flood affected areas and especially in the northern region.

Recognizing this need, Diya procured 5,000 woolen shawls (light blankets) from Bannu Woolen Mills at very economical price; Rs 390



per unit. 3,000 of these shawls were forwarded to the flood affected families in Swat via Army's Flood Relief Cell in Risalpur while 2,000 units were distributed to needy and deserving affectees in the rural vicinities of Nowshera under the supervision of Diya's team.

In addition, 500 cotton khes (light blankets) were distributed in Charsadda through dedicated volunteers and another 500 woolen khes were distributed to flood affected families in Rahim Yar Khan.

### **LifeStraw Water Purifiers**

As mentioned in the previous report, Diya Pakistan has imported 3,200 LifeStraw water purifiers for flood affected families. Each purifier can provide up to 18,000 litres of filtered water which is good enough for a family of five for up to three years. These units arrived on Karachi Port in the last week of September and were donated to Pakistan Air Force, Base Faisal for onward distribution to flood affected families.



In order to make it easy for the PAF team to explain the operating mechanism of this purifier to the flood victims, we had designed an easy-to-understand instructional brochure in plain Urdu language. A team of dedicated volunteers from Rukaiya Hajiani High School, Karachi inserted these brochures in all of the 3,200 water purifier units.

### **3 – Sustainable Rehabilitation**

One of the primary objectives of Diya's Flood Relief drive is Sustainable Rehabilitation.

During our visits to the flood affected areas in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, we recognized the need for providing sturdy houses/shelters to the very poor affectees that are no longer in a position to afford construction on their own. A reinforced structure of one room can accommodate a small family of 3-4 persons and serve as the base for restarting their normal lives.

In partnership with a dedicated team of KRL individuals, Diya is providing rooftop for one room houses built for destitute widows and deserving people in flood affected areas of District Charsadda. Earlier, these widows were residing in mud houses that have been washed away in recent floods.

So far, Diya has assisted in the completion of 50 such houses, some of which have already been inhabited by the flood affectees.



Diya plans to partner in similar housing projects in the provinces of Sindh and Punjab.

#### **4 – Educational Rehabilitation Programme**

Diya's donor community is driven by the passion for promoting education in Pakistan. Educational activities in flood affected areas have been disturbed severely. Apart from the structural damages, a major loss has been in the shape of inability of families to bear the minimal educational expenses of their children.

Diya's educational rehabilitation programme focuses on the immediate needs of these flood affected students. Diya plans to provide 10,000 educational scholarships in kind. Each student will be provided with a school bag with copies and stationery that can last for one academic year. In addition, students of a few selected institutes will also be provided with school uniforms.



So far, we have provided these bags and stationery to 2526 students of flood affected institutes of Khyber Pakhtoonkhwa and the response from students and teachers is very encouraging.

A detailed report of our visit to Govt. Girls High School No.2, Nowshera Kalan is also available on our website.

We are in the process of distributing 3,553 school bags and stationery to the flood affected students in 9 different institutes of District Layyah, which is one of the poorest and worst affected flood regions.

#### **5 – Conclusion**

Moving forward, Diya is focused towards implementing two programmes. Firstly, the construction of houses/shelters for displaced families whose mud houses have been washed away in recent floods and secondly, the educational rehabilitation in flood affected areas by addressing and alleviating the immediate needs of affected students.
